



**Data Interpretation**: By collectively weighing the above data, it shows that 64% from the total 71 respondents Agree on the various criteria laid down.

Based on the data provided in the Alumni-Structured Feedback Analysis Report for the 2018-2019 academic session, we can make the following interpretation:

1. **Overall Positive Response**: The majority of respondents either "Strongly Agree" or "Agree" with the various criteria, indicating a generally positive perception of the course. The total percentage of respondents who agree is 64%, which is a significant majority.

- Course Objectives and Clarity (A1): A significant portion (32.4%) "Strongly Agrees," and 63.4% "Agree" that the course objectives were clear. This is an essential aspect of a successful course.
- Manageable Workload (A2): A large percentage (64.8%) "Agree" that the course workload was manageable. This suggests that students did not find the course too overwhelming.
- Course Organization (A3): The majority (26.8%) "Strongly Agree" that the course was well
  organized, while 62% "Agree." This indicates that the course was structured in an orderly manner.
- Balanced Structure (A4): 22.5% "Strongly Agree" and 54.9% "Agree" that the course was well structured to achieve learning outcomes. The inclusion of lectures, tutorials, and practicals appears to be well-received.
- 6. Teaching and Participation (A5 and A7): A notable percentage (63.4%) "Agree" that learning and teaching methods encouraged participation, and 33.8% "Strongly Agree" that classroom teaching and delivery of the course were satisfactory.
- Interest Stimulation (A8): A significant portion (63.4%) "Agree" that the course stimulated their interest in the subject area, indicating the course's effectiveness in engaging students.
- 8. Appropriate Pace (A9): 66.2% "Agree" that the pace of the course was appropriate. This suggests that the course was neither too slow nor too fast for most students.
- Clarity of Ideas and Concepts (A10): While a substantial number (54.9%) "Agree" that ideas and concepts were presented clearly, it is worth noting that 7% "Disagree," indicating room for improvement in this area.

In summary, the feedback from the alumni is generally positive, with a majority of respondents expressing satisfaction with various aspects of the course. The course's objectives, organization, and teaching methods have received favorable reviews. However, there are some areas, such as the clarity of ideas and concepts, where a smaller percentage of respondents expressed dissatisfaction. It is essential for the institution to consider these feedback points to make necessary improvements in the course structure and delivery to further enhance the learning experience for students.



**Data Interpretation**: By collectively weighing the above data, it shows that 70% from the total 121 respondents Agree on the various criteria laid down.

Based on the data provided in the Alumni-Structured Feedback Analysis Report for the 2019-2020 academic session, we can make the following analysis:

- Overall Positive Response: Similar to the previous year's data, the feedback from alumni for the 2019-2020 academic session indicates a highly positive perception of the course. A significant percentage of respondents "Strongly Agree" or "Agree" with the various criteria, with a total of 70% in agreement.
- 2. **Clear Course Objectives (A1)**: A considerable majority (40.5% "Strongly Agree" and 57% "Agree") found the course objectives to be clear. This is essential for ensuring that students have a clear understanding of what they are expected to learn.
- 3. **Manageable Workload (A2)**: While 19% "Strongly Agree" and 61.2% "Agree" that the course workload was manageable, there is a smaller percentage (5.8%) that "Disagrees." This suggests that some alumni may have found the workload challenging, which might require further attention.
- 4. **Course Organization (A3)**: A majority of respondents (48.8% "Strongly Agree" and 59.5% "Agree") felt that the course was well organized. This indicates a positive perception of the course structure and layout.
- 5. **Balanced Structure (A4)**: The majority (32.2% "Strongly Agree" and 53.7% "Agree") believed that the course was well structured to achieve learning outcomes. The absence of "Disagree" responses suggests that the balance of lectures, tutorials, and practicals was satisfactory.
- 6. **Teaching and Participation (A5 and A7)**: An overwhelming percentage (68.6% "Agree" and 40.5% "Strongly Agree") found that learning and teaching methods encouraged participation. Additionally, 45.5% "Agree" and 40.5% "Strongly Agree" that classroom teaching and course delivery were satisfactory.

- Interest Stimulation (A8): The course appears to have successfully stimulated interest in the subject area, with 69.4% "Agree" and 22.3% "Strongly Agree."
- Appropriate Pace (A9): A significant portion of alumni (66.9% "Agree" and 24% "Strongly Agree")
  found the pace of the course to be appropriate. However, 8.3% "Disagree," suggesting that some
  may have found it too fast or too slow.
- Clarity of Ideas and Concepts (A10): While a substantial number (53.7% "Agree" and 34.7% "Strongly Agree") found that ideas and concepts were presented clearly, there is a notable percentage (7.4%) that "Disagrees," indicating that there may be room for improvement in this aspect.

In summary, the alumni feedback for the 2019-2020 academic session is overwhelmingly positive, with a large majority of respondents expressing satisfaction with various aspects of the course. The course's objectives, organization, teaching methods, and stimulation of interest have received particularly favourable reviews. However, as in the previous year, there are some areas, such as workload and the clarity of ideas and concepts, where a smaller percentage of alumni expressed dissatisfaction. These areas may require further attention and improvements to enhance the overall learning experience.





In the Alumni-Structured Feedback Analysis Report for the 2020-2021 academic session, we observe the following:

- 1. **Overarching Positive Sentiment**: The feedback from alumni in this academic session remains positive, with a significant percentage of respondents expressing agreement with the various criteria. A total of 72% of the 43 respondents agree with the given criteria.
- 2. **Clear Course Objectives (A1)**: A noteworthy portion (19.0% "Strongly Agree" and 28.9% "Agree") found the course objectives to be clear, which is essential for student understanding.
- 3. **Manageable Workload (A2)**: While 17.4% "Strongly Agree" and 26.4% "Agree" that the course workload was manageable, there is an absence of "Disagree" responses, suggesting a balanced workload.

- Course Organization (A3): A substantial portion (12.4% "Strongly Agree" and 25.6% "Agree") felt that the course was well organized, though 3.3% expressed dissatisfaction.
- Balanced Structure (A4): 14.0% "Strongly Agree" and 27.3% "Agree" that the course was well structured to achieve learning outcomes. It is worth noting that 5.0% "Disagree," indicating room for improvement in this area.
- Teaching and Participation (A5 and A7): 27.3% "Agree" and 33.9% "Agree" that learning and teaching methods encouraged participation. Additionally, 33.9% "Agree" that classroom teaching and course delivery were satisfactory.
- 7. Interest Stimulation (A8): The course continues to stimulate interest in the subject area, with 32.2% "Agree" and 15.7% "Strongly Agree."
- 8. Appropriate Pace (A9): 24.0% "Strongly Agree" and 25.6% "Agree" that the pace of the course was appropriate, with a minimal 2.5% expressing dissatisfaction.
- Clarity of Ideas and Concepts (A10): A significant number (33.1% "Agree" and 18.2% "Strongly Agree") found that ideas and concepts were presented clearly. There is only a minimal 0.8% "Disagree" response.

In summary, alumni feedback for the 2020-2021 academic session maintains a positive tone, with a majority of respondents expressing satisfaction with various aspects of the course. The course's objectives, workload, and overall teaching methods continue to receive favourable reviews. However, there are some areas, such as course organization and structure, where a minority of alumni expressed dissatisfaction, suggesting room for improvement in these areas to further enhance the overall learning experience.





- 2. Clear Course Objectives (A1): While 19% "Strongly Agree" and 28.9% "Agree" that the course objectives were clear, a noticeable 2.5% express dissatisfaction. Ensuring clear course objectives is crucial for student understanding.
- 3. **Manageable Workload (A2)**: A significant portion (20.7% "Strongly Agree" and 26.4% "Agree") found the course workload to be manageable. The absence of "Disagree" responses suggests an appropriate workload balance.
- 4. **Course Organization (A3)**: A substantial number (12.4% "Strongly Agree" and 25.6% "Agree") felt that the course was well organized. However, 2.5% expressed dissatisfaction, indicating room for improvement.
- 5. **Balanced Structure (A4)**: 22.3% "Strongly Agree" and 27.3% "Agree" that the course was well structured to achieve learning outcomes, with a minor 5% expressing dissatisfaction.

- 6. Teaching and Participation (A5 and A7): The majority (21.5% "Strongly Agree" and 41.3% "Agree") found that learning and teaching methods encouraged participation. Additionally, 41.3% "Agree" that classroom teaching and course delivery were satisfactory.
- 7. Interest Stimulation (A8): A substantial percentage (33.1% "Strongly Agree" and 32.2% "Agree") indicates that the course continues to stimulate interest in the subject area.
- 8. Appropriate Pace (A9): A significant portion (38.8% "Strongly Agree" and 40.5% "Agree") found the pace of the course to be appropriate, with a minimal 2.5% expressing dissatisfaction.
- Clarity of Ideas and Concepts (A10): A significant number (33.1% "Strongly Agree" and 40.5% "Agree") found that ideas and concepts were presented clearly. Only 0.8% "Disagreed."

In summary, alumni feedback for the 2021-2022 academic session remains positive, with a majority of respondents expressing satisfaction with various aspects of the course. 

In the Alumni-Structured Feedback Analysis Report for the 2022-2023 academic session, positive sentiment is discerned from the respondents.

The feedback from alumni for the 2022-2023 academic session is characterized by a pervasive and robust positive sentiment, with a strikingly high percentage of respondents expressing agreement with the various evaluated criteria. A comprehensive analysis of the data underscores the prevailing satisfaction with the course's various aspects, culminating in an impressive total agreement rate of 80% from the total of 43 respondents.

- Clear Course Objectives (A1): A notable proportion of alumni (19.0% "Strongly Agree" and 28.9% "Agree") indicated that the course objectives were clear, an essential aspect of effective education.
- Manageable Workload (A2): A significant segment of respondents (20.7% "Strongly Agree" and 26.4% "Agree") expressed contentment with the manageable course workload, reaffirming an appropriate balance.
- Course Organization (A3): A substantive number of alumni (12.4% "Strongly Agree" and 25.6% "Agree") found the course to be well organized. However, it is worth noting that 2.5% expressed dissatisfaction in this regard, highlighting potential areas for improvement.
- Balanced Structure (A4): A commendable percentage (22.3% "Strongly Agree" and 27.3% "Agree") acknowledged that the course was structured effectively to achieve learning outcomes, with only 5% expressing dissatisfaction.
- **Teaching and Participation (A5 and A7)**: Both learning and teaching methods, as well as classroom teaching and course delivery, were met with strong approval, with 21.5% "Strongly Agree" and 27.3% "Agree," along with 32.2% "Strongly Agree" and 32.2% "Agree," respectively.

- Interest Stimulation (A8): A substantial proportion (33.1% "Strongly Agree" and 32.2% "Agree") expressed that the course effectively stimulated their interest in the subject area, underlining the course's engaging quality.
- Appropriate Pace (A9): A majority of respondents (23.1% "Strongly Agree" and 33.9% "Agree") found the course's pace to be appropriate, with a negligible 2.5% expressing dissatisfaction.
- Clarity of Ideas and Concepts (A10): The majority of alumni (22.3% "Strongly Agree" and 33.1% "Agree") perceived that ideas and concepts were presented clearly, with only 0.8% expressing dissent in this aspect.

In sum, the alumni feedback for the 2022-2023 academic session manifests an overwhelmingly positive sentiment, with the majority of respondents expressing contentment with various facets of the course. The course's objectives, workload, teaching methods, and the clarity of ideas and concepts received consistently favourable reviews. While there are areas that could benefit from enhancement, this data underscores the course's overall efficacy and its alignment with the educational expectations and aspirations of the alumni.





## Employers' Feedback on Curriculum for the 2022-2023 Academic Session - Brief Analysis

The feedback from employers for the 2022-2023 academic session, regarding the curriculum, is summarized as follows:

- 1. **Relevance of Courses:** Employers found the courses in the college highly relevant to the work in their organizations. A significant number, 12 employers, rated this aspect as "Very Good" (A rating), indicating a strong alignment between the curriculum and workplace requirements.

This indicates approval of the curriculum's role in developing problem-solving skills.
- 4. **Overall Curriculum Content:** The overall content of the academic curriculum was well-received. 12 employers gave it a "Very Good" (A rating), and 5 employers rated it as "Good" (B rating). None of the employers indicated that it needed improvement (C rating).
- 5. **Applicability in Real Life:** A majority of employers (12) rated the applicability of the curriculum in real life as "Very Good" (A rating), while 5 employers rated it as "Good" (B rating). This suggests that employers believe the curriculum equips graduates with practical skills and knowledge for real-world scenarios.

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Depth of Course Content: The depth of course content received positive feedback, with 12
employers rating it as "Very Good" (A rating), and 5 employers rated it as "Good" (B rating).
None of the employers indicated that it needed improvement (C rating).

In summary, the feedback from employers for the 2022-2023 academic session is positive. Employers found the curriculum highly relevant, satisfying their current requirements, and effective in developing problem-solving skills. The overall content was well-regarded, and employers appreciated the curriculum's applicability in real life. The depth of course content also received favorable ratings. None of the employers indicated a need for improvement in any aspect.

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
