The workshop was targeted for the final semester students to equip themselves with skills and knowledge and enable them to transition smoothly to their post graduate endeavors.

Report of the events:

Workshop on Competence and Capacity Building was organised by the Department of Public Administration on 26th to 28th November 2020 in collaboration with Research and Consultancy Cell, Govt Hrangbana College. The workshop was attended by eighty four (84) students from sixth semester and fourth semester, Department of Public Administration. Two highly qualified professionals with extensive experience, Zorammawii Ralte and Esther Laltanpuii Khiangte from Mizoram Consultancy Group were engaged as resource persons for the workshop. Zorammawii Ralte completed her Masters from Stony Brooks University, New York and Esther Laltanpuii Pachuau had graduated from Brock University, Ontario, Canada and has completed her Masters in Business Administration in Entrepreneurship. The workshop started with a welcome address from the Head of Department, Miss Lianchhingpuii. The first day of the workshop (26th November) oriented the students to an introduction to the techniques, approaches and skills of capacity building. It was followed by topics on the importance of emotional well being and mental alertness, the need to develop digital literacy, how to use information technology and learning new courses focused on computer skills.
